WELCOME MARCHING FALCONS! The Marching Band at Wheaton North High School is rich in tradition. The kind of marching we do is a form of art which uses music and field marching to entertain the audience and impress adjudicators. You are joining a very special team and will create lifelong memories with them.

perform a different (shorter and easier) field show during football games which will be chosen by our section leaders and Seniors. This music will be given out at camp and the show will be learned at the post-camp rehearsals.

Football Game Schedule: We have five home games scheduled this year, not including playoffs. We will meet at 6:00 pm, dress, perform pre-game, play tunes in the stands, perform our show at halftime, return to the stands for the second half, and play exit music at the end of the game.

Competitions: One thing that attracts many young people to marching band is the feeling that you get when in competition. Our goal is not necessarily to win (though that is a great PERK!), but to out-perform ourselves each time we take the field. The pride that comes with those excellent performances and the thrill you receive from the crowd is unbelievable and cannot be measured. Competitions are concerts held in a football stadium and are governed by their own set of rules. Bands are classified by either band size or school size. Awards are given for Placement as well as for Outstanding Achievements in various captions.

Competition Schedule: We will attend 3 away competitions (day-long events) as well as host our own Falcon Marching Band Festival. We will always rehearse the day of a competition, travel to the contest, perform at our assigned time, watch other bands, await results, and hopefully perform in the evening finals at Lake Park and State.

Marching Band Banquet: This will take place on Monday, November 1st at 6:00 pm in the Commons, so we can get together with our families and celebrate a successful season! More info TBA.

Student/Family Cost, Forms: Marching Band is a fee-based activity. This fee is \$200.00 per student for the season, which covers a variety of expenses. Checks can be made out to "Falcon Band Parent Organization". Students using school owned instruments (including all percussion and color guard) also owe an additional \$35.00 fee. This fee covers rental for the entire school year. Other family expenses may include marching shoes, gloves, etc. These last items will be sized, ordered, and further explained at or after band camp.

Expectations

Marching Band at WNHS is a voluntary, *extra-curricular* musical activity. In other words it is not a part of our band classes and meets outside the school day. By joining you agree to the following expectations:

Attendance: Attendance is required for ALL rehearsals, games, and competitions. You are expected to attend and to be early. This is the same policy that Varsity athletic coaches hold their teams to at Wheaton North. Commitment is never a question until conflict arises

- Illness or family emergencies are excused absences. A detailed parental note or email explaining specific reason of the absence is required any time you miss rehearsal. Without these details, you might not be allowed to march the next performance.
- The last rehearsal before a performance is required. If you miss, you will not march the performance (no exceptions).
- Unavoidable preplanned absences (family weddings, etc) require one-month-advance detailed written notice from a parent or guardian. Please try to keep these absences to a minimum.
- WORK and HOMEWORK (specifically, projects or group projects) are not acceptable reasons to miss rehearsals. Please do not come to me the day of or the day before to tell me you can't be at rehearsal. If you miss for these reasons, you will not march the next performance.
- Excessive tardiness to rehearsals will result in not being allowed to march performances. ("Early" is "On Time", "On Time" is "Late".)

Behavior: The members of the Marching Band at Wheaton North High School are expected to strive for excellence in behavior as well as in performance. The rule is simple – be good kids at all times!! You are therefore expected to act with class, maturity, and professionalism. GUM is not allowed on the field or at rehearsal – this includes color guard and percussion. Unacceptable behavior can result in permanent removal

from the Falcon Marching Band. *Our goal – to be people of high integrity and admirable character at all times.*

Musical Expectations: The music is the life of the show. It is more important for us to play the music well than it is to march well. The expectations for musical performance are extremely high:

- It is preferred and highly encouraged that all members of the Marching band be enrolled in a curricular music class or band. You learn more in daily classes than you will on your own or in marching band rehearsal.
- All members of the marching band are expected to spend at least 30 to 60 minutes a day practicing their instrument or music. This is your *responsibility*. Technical problems need to be worked out individually prior to rehearsal
- All show music must be memorized.
- Anyone who does not perform up to expectations can (and probably will) be "benched".

Care and Treatment of Equipment: All instruments must be kept in excellent playing condition. Valves and slides should be oiled and greased regularly. Woodwinds should be swabbed after every performance, drum sticks should be taped and not cracked, pit mallets should not be worn out, etc. Brass instruments should be polished prior to all competitions. Wood instruments should not be used in marching band.

Care of Your Uniform: You will be issued a WNHS Marching Band Uniform and Shako (hat). The uniform is a symbol of the legacy of the Marching Falcons. The uniforms should be in EXCELLENT condition. They need to last a long time and are quite expensive. Treat them well.

- You may not wear any jewelry, chew gum, eat, or drink "sticky" beverages in uniform.
- All uniforms are to be hung neatly in uniform bags in the Uniform Storage Room in the band room. Your Shako will be kept in the storage room as well.
- Black marching shoes need to be polished prior to ALL performances. All students must have 2 pairs of BLACK socks in their uniform bag.
- All students will receive a season t-shirt and a pep band t-shirt at camp. The pep band t-shirt is worn under the uniform for ALL performances. The season shirt is worn publically at competitions.

Marching Season

The Marching band season goes from August through the end of the football season. It is a big time-commitment. We rehearse *considerably* less than other bands that we compete against, so we need to make *every* minute of rehearsal count! Prioritize your schedule and please mark your calendars now. If there are any potential conflicts, you should note them on the form provided. This schedule is as complete as possible at this time. I will try to provide at least a month notice if any changes need to be made to the schedule.

Rookie Clinic Sessions: It is important that all of the rookies are comfortable on the first day of camp. So, the section leaders and I will work with rookies several times before camp to help you learn our style of marching. These clinics are for your benefit, you need to be at 2 of the following 3 sessions – please dress comfortably:

July 19 (10am – 12 pm)

July 21 (2 – 4 pm)

July 23 (6 – 8 pm)

Band Camp: Band Camp the preseason conditioning for marching band and is **required** for all members, similar to the way that all fall sports teams have summer pre-season practices. Camp does not go all summer, it is only 1 week long. During this time we will learn fundamental music and movement skills and learn our field shows. If you miss camp, you almost always feel behind for the rest of the season, it's hard to make up that time. It's intense – but it's VERY fun. Be physically active *throughout the summer!* **EAT, EAT, EAT!** Load up on the carbs and liquids at every meal, **INCLUDING BREAKFAST!**

General Items that all Band Members Need to Bring to Band Camp (non-negotiable)

- Instrument & music or Flags/equipment
- *Large water jug or bottle (FILLED WITH COLD WATER or GATORADE, but NOT soda!)
- Sneakers & socks – No sandals! No bare feet! No exceptions!
- Hat – not visors! NO exceptions!
- Sunglasses and Sunscreen – HUGELY important for morning and afternoon rehearsals.
- Shoestring or lanyard
- Pencil
- The Guard should also bring: Guard gloves and black electrical tape
